Executive Directors' Report | J. Cotton-Castro

Reviewed written report.

Questions:

- Hosting a Maine Association of Charter Schools (MACS) meeting here next week? Yes Jacinda looking forward to this. Will include a tour of our school.
- Enrollment renewal letters going out to current families; is this earlier than usual? Possibly a little. Lottery will be first Wednesday in March, as usual. Enrollment for new families runs January 4 to end of February. People have been inquiring and taking tours.

- What outreach/advertising do we do for reaching potential new families? Thinking about inviting current families to ask interested friends to come visit. Suggestion that we do everything we can to reach out to a more diverse body of families.
- Increasing enrollment for next year? Yes though not increasing but rather looking to reach max enrollment approved by the Board last year.
- 5th grade band being established? Starting band in February, offering as a choice. One of our current violin teachers with some band experience is drafting a proposal of how this will look.

Jacinda's additions: Added a new item to her goals list - execute charter (previous goal was to submit renewal application, which was completed at the end of September.)

Education Committee Report | A. Gilman, J. Frankel

Reviewed written meeting minutes & goals.

Questions about committee minutes:

- How to we calculate holistic proficiency? Will be covered in Joanna's presentation.
- If we shift our charter renewal assessment condition to be based on the NWEA instead of MEA, will a change to our Charter be required? Not sure think not because the language of the condition seems negotiable.
- What does PEPG stand for? Professional Evaluation and Professional Growth it's our teacher evaluation program.

Coordinator of Teaching and Learning (COTL) presentation on Work Sampling System (WSS):

- Digging deep into our WSS has revealed a lot about our methods & implementation and prompted much thought about how we use this tool and how we can change our practice to maximize its utility and benefit.
- Q: How we define "Holistic Proficiency" not a part of the WSS published program, but rather something we devised ourselves as a way to look at each child's proficiency across measures within a domain. We recently discovered that teachers were measuring this Holistic Proficiency rating in different ways. We are now developing a rubric for calculating this score.
- Alignment between WSS and Common Core Standards Joanna explored the alignment that Pearson
 (WSS publisher) provides and saw that some categories do in fact align well and others simply do not
 and are somewhat forced. Joanna is in the process of reviewing and revising this alignment in a way that
 will be more useful for our application.
- Q: How do the teachers view the WSS work how invested are they and what is their attitude? It varies from teacher to teacher. Teachers of younger children value seeing the child holistically and are generally reticent about a detailed skill-by-skill rating; teachers of older children have a greater appreciation of the skill-by-skill breakdown.
- Joanna has looked at the fall ratings class by class and has noticed inconsistencies in the spread of the ratings (Not Yet/In Progress/Proficient). Looking into reasons behind inconsistencies differences in how teachers are assigning ratings?
- Looking across grade levels factoring in teacher-to-teacher variability and grade-to-grade changes in expectations noticing 1) a lot of Did Not Observe (DNO) in Science in the first two months of the year

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- and 2) data from 5th grade numbers appear too generalized perhaps the teacher is not reporting specific observations student to student, subject to subject.
- Q: Is there any trigger within this system for catching outlying students who need further support in any given area? Teachers would be noticing such things in their day-to-day work; wouldn't typically become aware of anything in the process of documenting the WSS that they wouldn't already have noticed in the course of their teaching.
- Q: When do we do Developmental Reading Assessments? Starting in 2nd grade.
- Q: Sounds like we might be considering using 3 assessments: NWEA, MEA, and WSS; suggestion that we might drop one so as not to overload our system. For later consideration due to time constraints of the meeting. (Iowa would be replaced by NWEA, so our number of assessments would actually not increase).
