AGENDA TOPICS: COVID POLICY (PUBLIC COMMENTS AS RECORDED FOLLOW AT END OF MINUTES)

CALL TO ORDER - WELCOME, BOARD CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Sally shared the numbers of Covid cases increasing in the school community.

Jacinda: Expressed thanks to everyone for getting to where we are today. Expressed great pride in the efforts of the staff and community.

Becky: Tested the 8th grade because of close contact. 2 more cases - when testing siblings found more cases. These particular cases indicate

8 positives today, 12 since Saturday. This is the highest we have seen this year. End of the year is bad timing and understandably difficult for kids to leave without saying goodbye.

Susan/Sally: we are also seeing cases of the flu/influenza in the school; current Covid is a highly contagious variant and we anticipate more cases going forward.

Jacinda: With input from staff, the recommendation is to go remote Thursday and Friday and come back Monday and/or Tuesday to celebrate the end of year.

Ben: Has the entire school been tested? Response: All except 6th grade

Carolyn: Does this recommendation include field trips? Response: Future schedule trips will be canceled,

Kim: Why are we considering flu/influenza in the counts? Response: It helps paint the bigger picture, and contributes to the overall percentage of absentee (15 % is the guidance)

Graduation: Jacinda will be reaching out to families to determine what's possible.

Becky: Most of the students have been masked; because we have 2 classes in quarantine, we've recommended everyone be masked; it's unknown what long Covid will bring.

Jacinda: Staff recommended moving to remote learning on Thursday and Friday, but based on Becky's perspective the recommendation to quarantine a full 5 days would include remote on Monday, coming back Tuesday for the last day.

Discussion: Do we consider a proposal to go remote Thursday, Friday, Monday?

Ben: Heartbreaking - we have 4 days of school left, inclined to stay in school, the risk of changing course at this time isn't worth it. Feel comfortable with sticking with the policy, and going to mandatory masking. Let's keep it responsible, as we have been.

Susan: we should go remote and come back next week - keep kids home if they have any symptoms.

Kim: Home tests are not always accurate - Becky, are you concerned with the efficacy of the tests? Also want to make sure we are thoughtful and considerate of folks who need to make sure they have plans in place for their children if we go fully remote. Response: Becky - Sometimes the tests are hard to read, but still better than nothing, and we are still seeing the home tests picking up the results- the pcr test is the standard, just a little harder to obtain.

Do we need a motion to require masking? Response: it's already in the policy-triggered when 2 classes go remote. So we are back to universal masking.

Motion to go remote Thursday Friday and Monday with a return to school on Tuesday, as long as students are asymptomatic and test negative:

Second: Sally

Discussion: Kim - need more information - what does remote mean? Feel this is a compound problem. Jacinda - shared an email Mara sent to staff; students have at-home learning packets; however, computers have been returned to school making the transition difficult.

Ben - we should continue to follow the guidance of what's in the policy Carolyn - heartbreaking decision to make - no winners only losers on either side of the decision

Susan - encourage the community to appropriately respond to the public health professionals.

Kim - torn about Tuesday as last day of school - emotional whiplash for the kids to leave for remote learning (which feels like the end of the school year) and coming back on Tuesday; but the thought of more kids getting Covid is not worth the risk of staying in school

Sally: We have an obligation to follow the guidance from public health

Motion approved: 3:1

Follow-up questions: When should students be tested? Becky - Tuesday morning or Monday night is preferable - as close to the return to school as possible.

What about field trips including those on the 6th grade camping trip? Response: they are being tested momentarily - if they test positive the trip will be closed down.

Can we entertain holding classes outdoors, which would include outdoor activities and field trips? A lot depends on the weather, and the current forecast is iffy at best.

Jacinda - suggest going remote Thursday Friday (if 6th grade tests positive, the camping trip would be shut down), outdoors Monday/Tuesday.

Sally - too many what-ifs, comfortable with what has just been approved

Kim - wouldn't have voted the way I did if I had known 6th grade was camping til Friday

Motion to void the vote Board just approved to go remote: Ben

Second: Carolyn Discussion: None Motion approved: 5:0

Motion to adhere to current policy with universal masking indoors, with the expectation all students will test on Monday (or Sunday evening), before returning to school on Monday: Carolyn

Second: Ben

Discussion: Susan- concerns that if this policy is passed there will be an increase in cases so hard for me to support this motion

Ben- have comfortability because we are bringing universal masking back into play, and this allows parents to make individual choices

Kim- a little disconnect when we say it allows families to make choices when it doesn't; can support this motion but can't support coming back to school tomorrow - would amend to state we come back on Monday

Sally - can't support the motion either. Can't support going against the science. It stinks that we are where we are, but here we are.

Vote 2:3, motion does not carry
