BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING AGENDA

Sept. 20, 2023, 6 pm Wednesday at Fiddlehead School and via Zoom

- I. Call to Order Quorum The meeting was called to order with three members present.
- II. Present: Ben Kramer, Susan Doughty, Bill Doughty. Marie Reimensnyder joined at 6:20.
 - A. Staff present: Jacinda Cotton-Castro, Exec. Dir.; Jason Manjourides, principal.
- III. Ben volunteered and read the mission of Fiddlehead School
- IV. There was no public Comment
- V. Comments about what's good at Fiddlehead:
 - A. How well new students are adjusting to the school community.
 - B. Title VI will be \$28,000 instead of \$22,000
 - C. Social justice and climate studies lenses are well supported
 - D. Even in times of staffing difficulty, people find Fiddlehead
 - E. Two students report enjoying the school start and the new people in their class.
- **VI.** Ben moved and Susan seconded to approve the minutes from Aug. 17, 2023. Motion carried 3 to 0.
- VII. Executive Director's Report
 - A. Great start feels different that last year and improved
 - B. Fantastic new people including Jason and others
 - C. RTI new space was effective and cost effective; not so crowded
 - 1. Have the break room back.
 - D. Working on school wide goals
 - E. After school enrichment now enrolls 18 students; hoping for more
 - F. First fund-raising event is Saturday Sept. 30; Fiddlehead etched glass for attendees
 - 1. Jacinda will do paella for 6
 - 2. Bill will do eggplant, pecorino and wine.
 - 3. Invite your friends
 - G. Working on marketing, goals, and grants
 - H. Questions/comments on the report
 - 1. Should we follow up on bus policy? See if it's working.
 - a) Now in Jason's job description
 - 2. Yurt update:
 - a) Not up due to the contractor wanting to change layout but we already agreed with the town to do it as laid out for code.
 - b) Hopeful for yurt raising to save and celebrate
 - 3. Staff room/and library question: Take to Jacinda first
 - 4. Enrollment stats: 196 enrolled; 18 in after care
 - 5. Marie asks to receive enrollment per grade
 - 6. Teamwork with Jacinda and Jason is working well.

VIII. Principal's report

- A. Curriculum, instruction, assessment
 - 1. Half days on Friday very valuable for work and professional development
 - 2. Focus on math
 - a) Develop revised scope and sequence; need to adapt to reality
 - (1) Include integration and outdoor classroom
 - 3. Assessment team is preparing for first round of NWEA
- B. Safety
 - 1. Did the first evacuation drill after each classroom practiced on its own.
 - 2. Carried out extensive students training in bus safety and behavior
- C. Community Outreach
 - 1. Looking forward to working with school volunteers. Will do a training session on the upcoming Tuesday.

D. Questions:

- 1. Can you record the volunteer training session? Yes, happy to do so.
- 2. Is fingerprinting required? Still researching that and type of background check that is needed
- 3. Are TAs involved in math training? Yes, they trained in summer too.
- 4. Are doors secured and sign-in being enforced?
 - a) Yes, Jason covers in his rounds. Teachers have taught students not to open for anyone.
 - b) Some suggestions on situations to consider were recommended.
- 5. Anything being done about the fence? Yes. One down section now up. Old gate still needs work.
- **IX.** Board norms were discussed briefly and agreed to.
- X. Board Policy Discussion: Our bylaws.
 - A. Remote voting to be considered. Discussion:
 - 1. Downside of not being there; upside of wider Board member pool
 - 2. Valuable if we get good Board members; careful it's not abused.
 - 3. Interest in what other boards are doing.
 - a) Charter schools may use remote voting
 - 4. Remote participation could be not quite as involved as in person
 - 5. Some support for being in person at some meetings.
 - 6. Could have a distance parameter; could expect some in person time
 - 7. Allowing out of state means former Fiddlehead students might become Board members.
 - 8. Clear expectations and parameters are important
 - 9. Parent voice is important; in the room for difficult decisions allows fuller communication.
 - 10. Suggestion that we develop a Remote Voting policy for consideration
 - a) Jacinda and Bill to work on this for the next meeting.
 - 11. Some support approving remote voting at each meeting as needed.
 - 12. Can set limits on the amount of remote attendance.
 - B. Board terms: Should Board members be allowed to serve two consecutive

terms?

- 1. Some traditional public school members serve multiple terms
- 2. On the other hand, we can burn out board members pretty fast
- 3. Previously ran with three new members each year; seems harder now.
- 4. How do Boards come to know the culture of the school?
- 5. Some would like a way to serve a little longer.
 - a) Current bylaws allow three years plus one plus one as needed.
- 6. We can get to a fifth year if needed.
- 7. Convoluted language about when and if a Board member can return.
- 8. Board members can recruit others and do so better when feeling happy on the Board.
- 9. Current structure of stretching to five years gets us close to six anyway
- 10. Board member or the Board may request the one year extension.

C. Board Committees:

- 1. Policy and Governance by Board as a whole
- 2. Finance under Ben's good leadership
- 3. Education Committee: Marie has agreed to serve.
- 4. Diversity Committee: Needs reactivation and is built into the culture
 - a) Jacinda/Jason will do some recruiting and send out the call
- 5. Personnel: Bill, Jacinda are on. They will ask Sally Morris is she will serve
 - a) Need a Board back up for Bill in case of family involvement
- 6. Wellness: Susan is chair. Need additional faculty members. Current nurse has helped a good deal.

XI. Finance Committee report by Ben

- A. We wrapped up August so these are quiet financial months at the school.
- B. Found a method to record summer salaries in a better way. Now we are showing estimates in July/August to be ready for the end of the year in June. In June we will reverse these estimates and put in the real costs.
 - 1. Used recommendation from MCSC
- C. Our monthly reports now include both the Board approved budget and the adjusted budget that shows the needed reductions. We will track to the adjusted budget number.
- D. Also added a section at the end that shows any Board approved moves from our reserve accounts.
- E. Ben will run an "Intro to Fiddlehead Finances" session at the next meeting to orient new Board members and to refresh for existing members.
- F. Susan moved and Ben seconded accepting the Treasurer's Reports for August. Motion carried 4 to 0
- G. Ben will report on the 3 year budget plan we have drafted that is required by MCSC.

XII. Update on COVID policy and Wellness Committee

- A. Susan thanked Katherine Uschmann, Diane Baker, and Jacinda for their help and support on the Wellness Committee.
- B. Our current policy and COVID funds use are on the Website. Susan reports that

- it is still valid and up to date.
- C. CDC policy is now that anyone may wear a mask at any time.
- D. State is gearing up if more is needed for current versions of COVID that are hitting the West coast.
- E. Free COVID tests are still available by mail.
- F. Newly available COVID shot is a vaccine, not a booster, to cover new variants.
- **XIII.** Move to executive session: Ben moves and Susan seconded to go into executive session. Motion passed 4 to 0.
- **XIV.** Post Executive session:
 - A. Ben moved and Susan seconded to hire Linda Wolcott as grade 1 TA at \$29,192
 Sidney Suarez as Resource Room TA at \$25,082. Motion passed 4 to 0.

Ben moved and Marie seconded to authorize the Executive Director to commit up to \$26,500 (from the unfilled ½ BC/BA position) to TA support as decided by the Executive Director. Motion passed 4 to 0.

Ben moved and Marie seconded to adjourn the meeting at 8:04 PM
